In Our Classrooms

At Home

- ◆ Read to my child and encourage my child to read on a daily basis for at least 20 minutes.

- ◆ Regularly monitor my child's progress in school.
- ◆ Participate in activities at school, such as volunteering and/or attending parent-teacher conferences.
- ◆ Read and be aware of the information in the school handbook.
- ◆ Respect the school, staff, students and families.
